Call for Reviewers

Description

The HOPE Careers Consortium is a partnership of five US colleges and universities whose mission is to create significant academic contributions to the field of orthotics and prosthetics. The Consortium is the recipient of an \$11.1M TAACCCT (Trade Adjustment Assistance Community College and Career Training) grant through the US Department of Labor.

The HOPE Careers Consortium is searching for professionals who work in the field of orthotics and prosthetics to review curriculum for its federally funded program.

Qualifying persons should currently hold one of the following positions:

- Faculty or Instructor of Orthotics and/or Prosthetics in an NCOPE accredited academic program. (knowledge of technician level O&P preferred)
- Currently employed for at least five years as an O&P technician or practitioner at an ABC or BOC accredited facility.

Reviewers will be asked to review curriculum from the following subjects. *

- Orthotic Fitter
- Mastectomy Fitter
- O&P Office Assistant
- Orthotic Technician
- Diabetes and the O&P Profession
- Intro to Musculoskeletal Anatomy (O&P)
- O&P Related Pathologies
- Therapeutic Shoe Fitter
- CAD CAM
- Certified Pedorthist
- Prosthetic Technician
- Medical Terminology for O&P
- Intro to Spinal Anatomy (O&P)

* Reviewers will choose the subjects they feel qualified to review.

Expectations

Reviewers will be expected to perform the following tasks during the review process.

1. Communicate directly with the HOPE curriculum review manager to facilitate the transferring and completion of review documents.
2. Participate in a 30 minute **online** rubric overview session using the HOPE Careers Consortium's conferencing software.
3. Apply a Consortium approved rubric to the HOPE curriculum under review.
4. Author a short summary of insights and recommendations using a pre-constructed template provided by the HOPE curriculum review manager.

Timeline

Reviewers will complete the review process between April 2015 and September 2015.

Compensation

Stipends of \$250 - \$500 will be provided to reviewers, proportional to the size of the curriculum reviewed.
