Valuable, Member Only ICD-10 Resource Available from AOPA

As the clock ticks down to the October 1, 2015 implementation date of the ICD-10 system for diagnosis coding, AOPA wants to make sure that you are aware of an AOPA members only resource to assist in the conversion of ICD-9 code to ICD-10 codes. AOPA has partnered with the folks at *Supercoder.com* to provide an easy to use ICD-10 bridge that will allow you to enter a current ICD-9 code and receive the corresponding ICD-10 code(s) back. This resource, available at <u>http://www.aopanet.org/coding-reimbursement/icd-10bridge</u> is available <u>at no cost</u> to AOPA members but you must log in to the AOPA site using the username and password of your main AOPA member site in order to access this free member benefit.

While the ICD-10 bridge is a valuable resource in helping to convert ICD-9 codes to ICD-10 codes, it is important to remember that the ICD-10 code that is reported on your claim must match the one assigned by the referring/ordering physician and is supported by their documentation. This includes the indication of whether or not the service being provided by you is part of an initial encounter, a subsequent encounter or a sequela encounter. You must not change or report a different ICD-10 code than the one that is provided to you.

Here are some other quick reminders and compliance tips about the ICD-10 conversion:

 The use of an ICD-10 code over and ICD-9 code will be based on your date of service. Any claim for an item/service with a date of service of October 1, 2015 and after must include the appropriate ICD-10 code. Any claim for an item/service with a date of service of September 30, 2015 and prior may still be submitted with the ICD-9 code.

- 2) Be sure to review future copies of the medical policies to see how the transition to ICD-10 may affect each policy. Below are some polices and links that are directly affected by the transition to ICD-10 codes, or those policies which require the use of specific diagnoses codes:
 - Future AFO/KAFO policy
 - <u>Future External Breast Prostheses Policy</u>
 - <u>Knee Orthoses Policy</u>
 - <u>Therapeutic Shoe Policy</u>
