Texas Passes Bill Providing for a Separate Definition of O&P from DME

In a victory for O & P Texas' Governor signed into law on May 9, 2011, S.B. 874, which requires the Health and Human Services Commission (HHSC) in Texas to establish a separate provider type for O & P providers for enrollment as a provider under Medicaid. This bill also prohibits O & P providers from being classified under the durable medical equipment provider type by HHSC or an agency operating a segment of the medical assistance program (when appropriate).

In Texas, orthotists and prosthetists are required to be licensed. The Texas Board of Orthotics and Prosthetics oversees and regulates orthotists and prosthetists and their facilities. Texas Medicaid & Healthcare Partnerships (TMHP) is currently in the process of switching enrollment processes to allow licensed orthotists and prosthetist to enroll as an orthotists or prosthetist provider under Texas Medicaid. Prior to this change, O & P providers were enrolled as durable medical equipment (DME) providers. Going forward, for dates of service after June 1, 2012, TMHP will only reimburse orthotic and prosthetic services to providers who are enrolled as an orthotists or prosthetist. TMHP will no longer reimburse DME providers for O & P services after May 31, 2012.

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AOPA Addresses a Particular ACO Question: Can an O&P provider participate in more than one Medicare Shared Savings Program ACO?

An O&P provider can participate in more than one Medicare Shared Savings Program ACO, subject to certain criteria.

The only circumstances in which a participant in an ACO may be limited to participating in only one ACO is if the participant is a primary care provider. We are not aware of any circumstances where an O&P facility would be considered as a primary care provider. In such circumstances, ACO participants are not required to be exclusive to one Medicare Shared Savings Program ACO. This means an O&P ACO participant is not limited to participating in only one Medicare Shared Savings Program ACO.

Please note that this only applies to participating in multiple ACOs within the Medicare Shared Savings Program. There are other ACOs, for example, operating in the private sector, and O&P providers will need to check the rules of such non-Medicare Programs for any rules they may have on multiple participation.

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AOPA FDA Compliance Workshop to Explore Emerging Concerns in O&P

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Announcing 2012 Policy Forum: April 17-18 in Washington, DC


