John "Mo" Kenney Named 2015 "Hero of the Year"



John "Mo" Kenney was recently named 2015 "Hero of the Year" by the American Red Cross Bluegrass Chapter. The Heroes Campaign is a community awareness and fundraising initiative that raises money for critical Red Cross services and recognizes those people making a difference in the community. Campaign donors had the opportunity to nominate volunteers who have made significant, positive impacts in our region.

AOPA member John "Mo" Kenney of Kenney Orthopedics was presented with the 2015 Hero of the Year. Mo is an amputee who has made it his life's mission to serve the community of amputees with quality care. He works both locally and globally on humanitarian missions, seeing amputees who do not have insurance, financial resources, or access to quality care, resulting in the fabrication of customized prosthetics from used and donated parts. In addition to his missions, he partners with Paralympic Athletes to offer an Amputee Walking School, free of charge to amputees, designed to improve their gait and quality of life. He also supports the local Wounded Warriors and the Permanently Disabled Jockey Fund.

AOPA Member and Shriners Orthotist Travels to Capitol Hill to Advocate for Son with Mitochondrial Disease

Dino Scanio, CO, LO of Tampa Florida, Shriners Hospitals for Children, has no limits as he raises awareness for his son's progressive Mitochondrial Disease (Myopathy) and the challenges that children with special needs face. Dino and his 9 year old Giovanni arrived to Washington on June 16, 2015 for a weeklong trip as they visited Capitol Hill to advocate for a cure for Scanio's 4 year old son Gianluca and others with this diagnosis, who face a mountain of medical obstacles.

Mitochondrial diseases result from failure of the mitochondria. Mitochondria are responsible for creating more than 90% of the energy needed by the body to sustain life and support growth. When they fail, less and less energy is generated within the cell. Cell injury and even cell death follow. If this process is repeated throughout the body, whole systems begin to fail, and the life of the person in whom this is happening is severely compromised. The disease primarily affects children and is often life threatening/shortening. Symptoms may include loss of motor control, muscle weakness and pain, gastro-intestinal disorders and swallowing difficulties, poor growth, cardiac disease, liver disease, diabetes, respiratory complications, seizures, visual/hearing problems, lactic acidosis, developmental delays and susceptibility.

Father and son presented their story to their Florida representatives. Scanio spoke about the effects of Mitochondrial Disease and how it has affected his life as an orthotist. Four year old Gianluca uses Solid High Profile Ankle Foot Orthoses (AFOs) and is evaluated yearly for bracing needs. He will likely progress into Knee Ankle Foot Orthoses (KAFOs) as the disease advances. Giovanni stood proud next to father as he held a poster board with pictures of his brother and answered legislators and staffers' questions. The Scanios joined others from the state of Florida advocating for a cure. One June 18, 2015 the color green was worn to represent Mitochondrial Disease and was noticed throughout Capitol Hill as hundreds from around the country were joined in the fight to raise awareness.

Scanio comments, *"It's already difficult enough casting your own son for braces but knowing, it will not fix the problem leaves me hallow. It will only get worse and hard to maintain successful bracing"*. The trip ended with life long memories and a sense of optimism. Dino Scanio feels that sharing the struggle families with special needs children face will transcend into finding a cure.

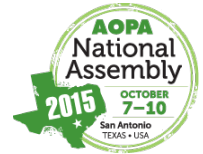

Exoskeletal power assist in orthopedic rehabilitation and treatment in neurologic deficiencies will change quality of life and training intensities in the near future. New actuation approaches, control inputs from movement kinetics and kinematic but also biosignals are shown and controversially discussed in a German American session. 	Urs Schneider, PhD, MD, is head of the Fraunhofer Orthopedics Research Department in Stuttgart. He is a medical doctor and leads an interdisciplinary engineering team with research focused on improved mobility solutions in rehabilitation and orthopedic surgery.
	Kevin Hollander, PhD is the Director of Product Development at SpringActive, Inc. Dr. Hollander has been actively performing research and engineering development activities for more than 20 years. His areas of interest have included biomechanics and clinical based research as well as the development of numerous wearable robotic projects. His recent focus has been the development of exoskeleton, robotic gait assistance devices for both able bodied and patient populations.
	Bernhard Budaker, Dr.-Ing. Currently serves as the Deputy Head of Department and Group Manager for the Fraunhofer Institute for Manufacturing Engineering and Automation, Stuttgart, Germany. Dr. Budaker is an electrical engineer and received his PhD in mechanical engineering from the University of Stuttgart. His research interests are in the field of electronic motors and their application. He is working on different types of active powered devices in the field of P&O, including active driven Knee prosthesis, active orthotics and wheelchairs.
	Homayoon Kazerooni, PhD is the director of the Berkeley Robotics and Human Engineering Laboratory and also the Co-founder and Chief Scientist of Berkeley Bionics. Dr. Kazerooni's work focuses on the control of human-machine systems specific to lower human extremities. Dr. Kazerooni holds a Doctorate in Mechanical Engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and has over 30 years of mechanical engineering experience. He has published more than two hundred articles, delivered over 70 plenary lectures in the U.S. and internationally, and holds seventeen pertinent patents. As a noted authority on robotics, he is frequently profiled and quoted in the media.
