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**Filing Deadline TOMORROW for the Low Volume Appeals (LVA) Initiative**

For those suppliers whose NPI numbers end in an odd number (1,3, 5, 7, 9) and have fewer than 500 appeals pending at Administrative Law Judge level or higher, and each appeal has a total billed amount of \$9,000 or less, you may file an expression of interest for a limited settlement agreement. The agreement will result in a timely one-time partial payment of 62% of the net Medicare approved amount of the appeals in question.

If your NPI number ends in an odd number and you wish to take part in the LVA your [expression of interest](#) must be filed by [April 11, 2018](#).

## AFO/KAFO Policy Has Been Revised

The DME MACs recently released a series of revisions to the AFO/KAFO Medicare medical policy with an effective date of 01/01/17. The revisions were predominantly clerical (e.g. include language associated with the 21 Century Cures Act and updating the list of off-the-shelf/custom fitted braces) and should not have a direct effect on your coding, billing and medical necessity determinations. In addition the revised policy now states in writing that walking boots (L4360, L4361, L4386 or L4387) are all inclusive and may not be billed with any other add-on codes.

## New Medicare ID Cards are being Mailed this Month

Just as a reminder the first two waves of mailings of the new Medicare ID cards with a Medicare Beneficiary Identifier (MBI), instead of the current Health Insurance Claim Number (HCIN), have begun this month and will continue until June. The first wave includes beneficiaries in: Delaware, District of Columbia, Maryland, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and West Virginia. The second wave includes beneficiaries in: Alaska, American Samoa, California, Guam, Hawaii, Northern Mariana Islands, and Oregon. With these mailings Medicare will start the transition period of allowing claims to use either the old HCIN or new MBI. ## AOPA Confirms K0903 Medicare Fee Schedule at Same Rate as A5513

Recently, AOPA announced an important Advocacy victory regarding the Medicare fee schedule amount for K0903, the newly created HCPCS code used to describe direct milled, custom

fabricated diabetic inserts. When K0903 was first announced, CMS indicated that the Medicare fee schedule would be approximately \$5.00 less than the current fee schedule for A5513 which describes custom fabricated diabetic inserts molded over a positive model of the patient's foot. AOPA challenged this position and presented several arguments that supported the direct crosswalk of the Medicare fee schedule for A5513 to the fee schedule for K0903.

Last week, AOPA announced that CMS had issued a bulletin indicating that the fee schedule for K0903 would be set at \$43.56, the current Medicare fee schedule for A5513. CMS has released the Medicare fee schedule update for April 1, 2018 and AOPA has confirmed that the Medicare allowable for K0903 has indeed been established at \$43.56, the identical fee schedule amount for A5513.

AOPA is proud of this advocacy victory, not only for what it represents for providers of diabetic inserts, but also for the precedent that it sets for future issues involving the use of scanning and other technology to create alternate manufacturing processes in orthotics and prosthetics.

### **AOPA Submits Comments on Proposed Rule that Would Impact Coverage of Essential Health Benefits**

On March 6, 2018, AOPA submitted comments on a proposed rule that would change the definition of the term “employer” as it relates to association health plans and the requirement to cover “essential health benefits” under provisions of the Affordable Care Act (ACA).

The proposed rule states that by expanding the definition of the term “employer” association based health plans will have new opportunities to negotiate terms with insurance companies that will benefit its members. AOPA’s primary concern with the proposed rule is that the proposed expansion of association health plans will significantly reduce the requirements for these plans to provide coverage for health benefits, including orthotics and prosthetics, which have been designated as essential health benefits by provisions of the ACA.
